

## BTO: Participation in the European Coordination Via Campesina (ECVC) event 'New GMOs, Patents and the Peasants' Rights to Seeds in Europe

DG SANTE and GROW were invited to the event organised by ECVC focusing on the use of new genomic techniques (NGTs), patents, and peasants' rights to seeds in relation with the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Peasants and Other People Working in Rural Areas (UNDROP).

The European Patent Office (EPO) presented the state of play on patents in plants as well as the ongoing dispute on the products of biological processes, and provided some statistics on patented products. The made a case on why the regulation of gene editing will not hurt small and medium size companies, while the followed up with an overview of the effect of patents on seeds on the global seed market share concentration. Finally, the explained the concerns of ECVC related to the patents on NGTs.

The event was concluded by a round table with short interventions from DG SANTE E3, G1 and DG GROW F3. On NGTs, E3 explained the recent request of the Council to the Commission to submit a study on the status of NGTs, focusing on its working methods, and specifically the stakeholder consultation process and the expected input from other Commission services and EFSA. The round table was followed by a brief Q&A session.
