After the publication of an open-source detection test for Cibus' SU Canola, uncertainty has arisen over the GMO status of this rapeseed, as well as the legal requirements on GMO detection tests used to identify unauthorised GMOs.

I understand that the Regulatory Committee 2001/18/EC will discuss the detection method, as well as the EURL/ENGL opinion on it, at its upcoming meeting this [Thursday, 12 November](#).

The attached briefing sets out why SU Canola is a GMO under EU GMO law. We are hoping that you, as the chair of the Regulatory Committee 2001/18/EC, will insist that EU member states take action to ensure this unauthorised GMO does not enter the EU's food supply illegally.

I would also like to ask you to please share the attached briefing with all members of the Regulatory Committee.
