SUBJECT : Coordination of _____

1. Friday, 21 January 1966, I met with Dr. _____ Chief, Division of Toxicology, _____ for the purpose of discussing the _____ on drug Screening.
2. After a brief review of the proposal in my presence, Dr. _____ stated that, on the surface the proposal looked acceptable, but that he would prefer to study it in detail. I left the proposal with him and informed him that I would return within a week.
3. Thursday, 27 January 1966, I returned to _____ to confer with Dr. _____ once again concerning the _____ Proposal.
4. Dr. _____ first comment was that the techniques described seemed too elaborate and that simpler tests could be used to evaluate incapacitating agents. I explained that we were looking for more subtle effects than frank incapacitation. He agreed, that in this case, the suggested techniques were rational.
5. Dr. _____ only other objection was the introduction of basic pharmacology early in the screen. I agreed, on this point and will take it up with Dr. _____
6. Dr. _____ stated that the price was in line with his experience. He also stated that _____ was capable and did work for _____
