MEMORANDUM FOR THE FILE

29 May 1952

SUBJECT: Proposal for Research on Methods of Eliciting Information [REDACTED] C

1. On 21 May 1952, following a telephone call from [REDACTED] C
[REDACTED] who suggested that CIA might care to consider a
proposal from [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] on the subject of "Methods
of Eliciting Information". [REDACTED] contacted [REDACTED] A
[REDACTED] and obtained the proposal
dated 14 August 1951. A thermofax copy of the proposal is attached.

2. A review of [REDACTED] proposal indicates that it is
principally exploratory in nature and it offers little of a specific
nature to supplement active or previously terminated projects of a
similar nature. Accordingly, and in view of the large sums of money
requested, it is recommended that this proposal not be considered
by CIA. C

3. The original proposal was returned to [REDACTED] C
28 May 1952. He was advised that CIA was not currently interested
in such a proposal, however, if interest in such an exploratory
program should develop in the future, that he would be contacted.
