We propose to isolate from various animals (including man) by nasal swab organisms that are classified by usual bacteriological techniques as Staphylococcus aureus. Strains of S. aureus are important as causative agents of infection in man and, also, for production of a toxin that causes food poisoning in man. Strains of S. aureus also cause infection in other animals. We propose to study in vitro and in vivo characteristics of S. aureus strains from various animal species to determine if host adaptation occurs in the staphylococci as does occur for example, in the salmonellae. In vitro characterization will include test for various hemolysins, type of coagulase, lipase activity, DN ase activity, fibrinolysis, phage pattern and antibiotic sensitivity. In vivo characterization will include test for dermoncerotic toxin, enterotoxin, and infectivity for mice.

1. RESEARCH PLAN:

A. Specific Aims

To characterize by both in vitro and in vivo studies Staphylococcus aureus of various animal origins (including man) to determine if host adaptation of these microorganisms occurs. For example, are S. aureus isolated from human beings different from S. aureus isolated from dogs?

B. Method of Procedure

Isolation from nasal swabs (and infections where available - e.g., boils in man, arthritis in chickens, mastitis in cattle, bladder infections in mink) of S. aureus using mannitol salt agar, Difco 110 agar, and tellurite glycine agar. After establishment of pure cultures determine kind of hemolysins, phage type, type of coagulase, lipase activity, fibrinolysis, DNase, and antibiotic sensitivity. In vivo characterization will include test for dermonecrotic toxin, enterotoxin, and infectivity for mice. A long term approach would include serological studies of possible differences between strains using the Ouchterlony technique.

C. Significance of This Research

The biology of the staphylococci needs investigation to determine if there is adaptation to different animal species. Such terms as "human" staphylococci, and "bovine" staphylococci are used without a real basis for their use except to mean the source of the particular culture.

D. Facilities Available

Laboratories and animal rooms are available. No unusual equipment is required and the usual bacteriological equipment is available.

[REDACTED] The purpose of this laboratory is to make a continuing survey of rabies in wild animals by trapping. Through the cooperation of Public [REDACTED] we obtain nasal swabs from the animals. This then gives a source of wild animals that have not been in contact with man.

2. PREVIOUS WORK DONE ON THIS PROJECT:

We have used most of the techniques listed in Paragraph B (Research Plan) in studies on the pathogenesis of staphylococci. We have also studied the in vitro characteristics of staphylococci causing acute bovine mastitis and chronic bovine mastitis. We have started to isolate staphylococci from nasal swabs of various animals. During the past year we have examined nasal swabs from deer, foxes, skunks, and opossums as well as from laboratory animals such as rabbits and mice. We are currently doing laboratory in vitro tests on the staphylococcal cultures that have been isolated.

4. RESULTS OBTAINED BY OTHERS:

Many workers have characterized staphylococci isolated from nasal swabs from human beings (Elek, S. D. "Staphylococcus pyogenes and Its Relation to Disease" 1959, E. and S. Livingstone Ltd., Edinburgh and London), and from milk from dairy cattle (Reid W. and Wilson, J. B., Am. J. Vet. Res. 20: 625 (1959)). There has also been extensive work on characterization of staphylococci from infections in human beings, but limited work has been done on characterization of staphylococci from infections in other animals (e.g. Smith, H. W., J. Path. and Bacteriol. 67: 73 (1954). Rountree (J. of Path. and Bacteriol. 72: 319 (1956) has done Phage typing of staphylococci from nasal swabs from various laboratory and domestic animals. Thus it would seem appropriate in a laboratory where extensive work on staphylococci per se is being done that a detailed investigation be carried out of the characteristics isolated from various animal species.

The varieties of toxins produced by the various Staphylococci as well as the intensity will be determined as sub-areas in this study. It is expected that the eventual goal of this investigation will be biochemical tests which will identify the organisms of interest.



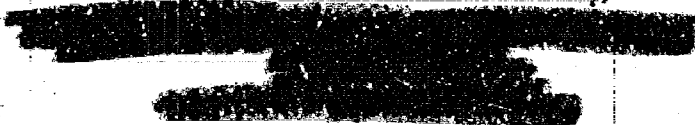
