Hello Ken and Kelly,

Meet Erinn. Erinn is our main packaging person for just about everything users download and run. She's also become a recent public speaker about Tor, having done a number of recent talks in Chile, Sweden, and Portugal.

She is currently in Russia and did a talk at Moscow State University on Tor. She's received some good feedback and introductions to other people in the larger Russian citizen journalism sphere. In the past you've mentioned that BBG is concerned about what is going on in Russia, even if it's isn't the hot country according to the US media.

Erinn met someone who works with citizen journalists in the Caucasus (<http://www.enq.kavkaz-uzel.ru/>) and deals with the kinds of activists who'd be squarely within Tor's targets. That said, he's really interested in working on training materials with Tor, the kind that can be generalized enough that they're easy to adapt for specific regions.

Can you help us better engage with the larger ex-Soviet sphere of journalists? Are there related materials you've already created and distributed to help us jumpstart such an effort?

I'm planning on being in DC in early January 2011. If you're around, I can stop by and we can talk more about a plan to move forward with such an engagement.

Hi folks,

Attached is my first go at this overall Tor strategic roadmap. There's a lot of info in it, and I know some of it is still rough, but hopefully it gives you a better sense of where we'd like to go and how you can help us get there.

There are three milestones in here for BBG.

"Year0.5" is Sept 2008 to Feb 2009. This is money from the current contract, so it helps explain where the current money is going.

The next milestones we have in mind are "Year1.0" (March 2009 to August 2009) and "Year1.5" (Sept 2009 to Feb 2010). I only mapped out where the BBG money would be most useful up through Feb 2010, since it will make more sense to decide later details in 2009.

I've also scattered some 'Unfunded' items throughout, so we can keep those in mind in case we run across people who want them finished.

We can talk more about it on Thursday, or feel free to ask questions earlier.

In 2008, we have 0.5 full-time admin (half of Roger), 3.5 full-time developers (Nick, Steven, Jake, and the other half of Roger), and 3 part-time developers (Matt, Karsten, Peter).

Starting in 2009, if all goes well, we're going to be ramping up to 1.5 full-time admins (Andrew and half of Roger), 6.5 full-time developers (Nick, Steven, Jake, 1/2 of Roger, and now Mike Perry, Martin, and Karsten), and two part-time developers (Matt and Peter).
