Hello Ken and Kelly,

We have filed a formal protest to be determined a small business under the SBAs own guidelines, as outlined below by Tor's DoD contract lawyer:

"General answer to your Q: SBA indicates on its web site that non-profits are eligible for its "small business concern" programs, despite the actual definition its gives that phrase in 13 CFR 121.105 (i.e, organized for profit):

Nonprofit Organizations

A nonprofit organization uses its profit to improve its services, rather than pay dividends to investors. If your organization is registered as a nonprofit, you are eligible for certain programs including grants, government surplus and tax exemptions. We've collected links to programs and services to help nonprofits find the opportunities that are available to them from the federal government.

The important issue here: The federal procurement contract requirement in the FAR that imposes a Small Business Subcontracting Plan on all prime contractors and all their subcontractors at any tier, who are not small, doesn't explicitly have any different rules for 501c3 entities. ALL contractors and subcontractors have this obligation; exceptions are for "commercial-item" awards as defined by the FAR, and for "small business concerns." The statement above, from SBA, indicates that a nonprofit may claim small business concern status, despite the language of the label and despite its definition. I long ago stopped being surprised by SBA's seemingly contradictory or illogical positions; they are what they are.

So, if Tor meets the size standard set by SBA for a Tor NAICS code, Tor may rely on this SBA clarification for nonprofits, and claim exemption from having a Small Business Subcontracting Plan. If BBG/IBB have a strong objection, they can ask SBA to review the specific situation and make a ruling on your eligibility (called a Size Appeal)."

1a. Continue making Tor more suitable for blocked or blockable users (concrete items)

- Normalize our TLS handshake even more; play that arms race as needed.
- More work on BridgeDB to be able to distribute more bridge addresses while being less vulnerable to attackers.
- Auto detect proxies (and Tor exit addresses!) and treat them as one location.
- Try to give a mix of long-term-stable bridges and
- running-on-port-443 bridges in the address sets we hand out. - Offer "split downloads" so people on modems can actually fetch the large bundles without always failing halfway through.
- Make progress on tools to measure whether exit nodes are behaving correctly. Start running automated scans on the network, and tie the results into directory authorities so we can have real-time feedback from misbehaving nodes.
- Support clients that have only IPv6 addresses, and support destinations that have only IPv6 addresses.
- Add Polipo to the standard Vidalia bundles, so we can get rid of Privoxy forever.
- Stabilize the "Torbutton-dev" work so we can give people a robust Firefox extension that not only lets them toggle Tor on/off, but also protects them from many application-level threats on the web.

1b. Continue making Tor more suitable for blocked or blockable users (research items)

- Build a design for "auto updating" Tor via Vidalia.
- Fewer descriptor downloads: Instrument a Tor client to count number of descriptors downloaded via networkstatus vs how many circuit extends it does. Write a proposal for how to switch to fetching descriptors at each extend rather than en masse on bootstrap. Show some numbers on how much overhead we should (theoretically) save with this approach. When it's clear that we should, switch.
- Study and begin implementing GeoIP-based data gathering for normal (non-bridge) entry nodes, so we can continue keeping general summary stats about our user base. Once this is determined

to be safe, build a design for "directory guards": clients can ask directory questions directly to their entry guards, and any question that the entry guards can't answer will be tunneled via Tor to a mirror or authority that can.

 Research whether bridge users need to choose a second "layer" of entry guards, so it's harder for an ordinary Tor middle server to enumerate bridge relays by seeing who connects. Start solving this problem somehow, for example by making bridge users do the above.

2. Continue making it easy to run relays, bridge relays, and bridge authorities.

- Get UPnP support into Vidalia
- "ORPort auto" config option, to look for bindable/reachable ports.
- libevent support for Windows, so people can run Tor relays on low-resource Windows computers without crashing them.
 Improve memory-allocation issues to improve stability of
- relays and bridges. Investigate better buffer approaches in Tor, better buffer approaches in openssl, and shipping Tor with its own integrated allocator.
- Understand the risks from letting the attacker send traffic through your relay while you're also initiating your own anonymized traffic. There are some very effective-looking attacks published by Murdoch/Danezis and McLachlan/Hopper that we need to learn more about; worst case we should tell people to not relay traffic temporally near to when they're sending or receiving their own traffic, and then make that easier to set up.
- Get us to the point where the Vidalia alpha bundle can ship with bridge relaying turned on by default.

3. Keep scaling the network as a whole.

- Reach 2500 relays and 500 bridge relays.
- Decide whether the incentives paper is worth doing, and if it is, build a roadmap for how to implement and deploy it.
- Continue research on how to splinter the network as it grows so we can maintain a good balance of both anonymity and scalability.
- Continue research on switching to a UDP design; we're unlikely to actually switch in the 2008 timeframe though.
- Continue research on more efficient load balancing in the Tor network. This can come via better bandwidth estimation, and/or via selecting faster paths, and/or something new.

4. USB (Tor Browser Bundle) and LiveCD (Incognito) maintenance and new work. Make significant usability progress on at least one of them (probably Tor Browser Bundle).

- Add Pidgin (AIM) + Off-the-record messaging to Tor Browser Bundle.
 Become able to run Tor Browser Bundle and normal Firefox at the same time.
- Integrate Tor Browser Bundle into the Tor download page, and keep the documentation and explanations for it simple and up-to-date.
- Analyze Tor Browser Bundle for any traces left on a host machine after use. Document them, and try to reduce footprint.
- Add an inconspicuous progress indicator for Vidalia while it's starting Tor. This is useful to know how far along it is in the startup process (especially for users with slow network), and also to give the user a sense of whether startup is going to fail.

5. Translation portal

- Start with: a website explaining how to do web-based Vidalia and Torbutton translations

- (This includes setting up web-based Vidalia and Torbutton translation sites.)
- Then get to translating the web pages for Tor, Torbutton, Tor browser bundle, etc, either also with web-based translation or with very clear instructions.
- Set up, manage, and coordinate a translation team to keep the most common translations up to date, and to support and encourage new translators as they arrive and want to help.

6. More active user and project support

- Clean up and update FAQ and documentation in general.
- Continued communication and coordination with people in our three target countries, to spread the word and to get feedback on our progress and requirements.
- Develop "who uses Tor" use cases, make website more broadly appealing/readable, continue outreach to law enforcement, NGOs, and other groups who need to believe in Tor for it to remain sustainable.
- Start using the Tor blog more actively to communicate with our user base, and to spread information and "project clue" to more than just Roger.
- Related to the above, build and start deploying a contingency plan: "what happens if Roger gets hit by a bus?"
